


SLGA - Strengthening Advisory Capacities for Land Governance in Africa

Research Fellowships for research stays or field studies



 1-3 months research stay or field study at one of the NELGA partner universities or associated institutions

Topic:

Land & Conflicts in the trans-border region between Chad, CAR and Cameroon

Benefits:

- a flat-rate travel allowance depending on the country of destination
- a monthly research allowance of EUR 460

Research Fellowships for research stays or field studies

Important:

- Precise and detailed explanation/motivation for the research stay
- Overall question: What is the added value?

Eligibility:

- student or a staff member at one of the NELGA partner universities or associated institutions
- Undergraduate degree must have been completed
- Successful completion of the MOOC on "Land and Conflicts"
- No financial support to research at the applicant's home institution

Research Fellowships for research stays or field studies

Submission of application:

- Precise and detailed explanation/motivation for the research stay
- Schedule of the planned research stay
- Letter of reference from a university teacher
- CV, diplomas, list of publications...

Application deadline:

- > 01.06.2023 to 17.07.2023
